Several members of ARBiH² who had defected from the territory of Srebrenica were moving along the march route of Srebrenica-Žepa-Radava-Veliki džep³[sic]-Makote-Donja međa⁴[sic]-Visočnik-Pjenovac-Nevačka-Rječice-Donje brdo⁵[sic]-Sokoline, and along the Jezernica river to the tunnel in Kladanj, and they did not notice any Chetnik⁶ formations or v/ps⁷ along that route.

According to their testimony, there are no elite forces or larger military formations around Srebrenica. More than 50% of the trenches are empty, and the lines are manned mostly by old men. On the Han Pijesak-Sarajevo road, on the 21 and 22 June, they noticed very intensive traffic in both directions. During the night between 21 and 22 June 1995, they noticed a column consisting of 12 trailer-trucks covered with tarpaulin escorted by military and civilian police, escorting some sort of large cargo heading towards Sarajevo.
